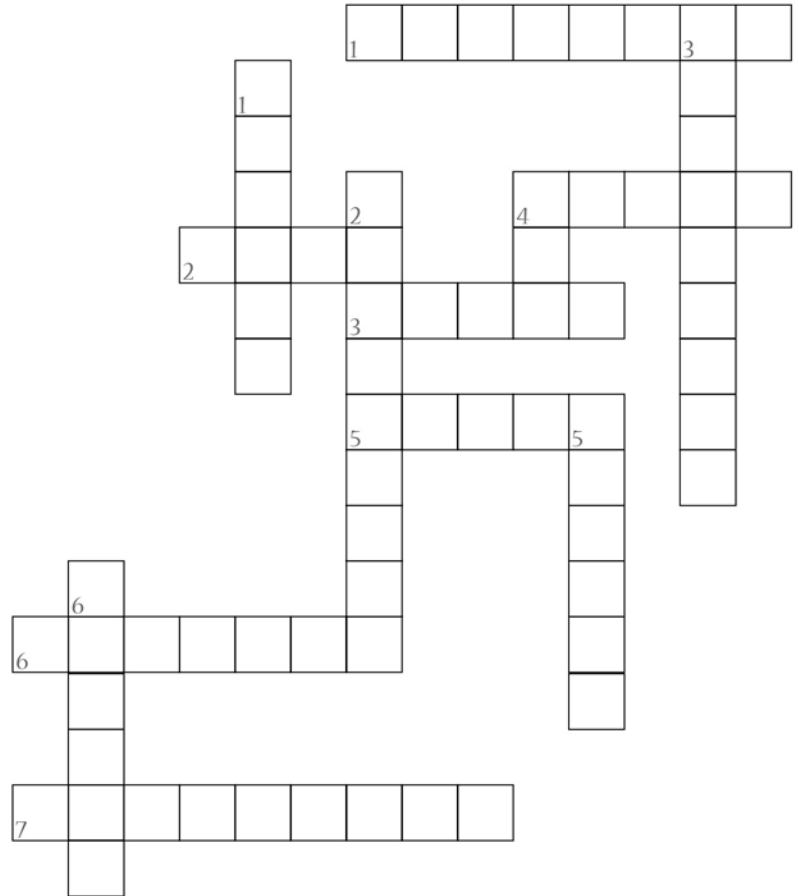

When we study GEOGRAPHY (which really just means the study of the Earth's surface), we learn about the different lands and waters of the Earth.

Geographers have split the Earth's waters into five major OCEANS. The Earth also has several

SEAS, which are large bodies of water connected to an ocean. When there is a large body of water surrounded by land, it is called a LAKE. Most large lakes have RIVERS that connect them to an ocean or sea.

Geographers have split the earth's lands into seven CONTINENTS: Asia, Europe, Africa, North America, South America, Australia, and Antarctica. A section of land that is controlled by a single government is called a COUNTRY, and most continents have many different countries. A lot of countries are split smaller sections called PROVINCES or STATES, which have their own governments that work with the country's government. REGIONS are unofficial sections of land, meaning that a lot of times do not have their own governments or very set BORDERS.

Geographers have also given names to different shapes of land. For example, a piece of land surrounded by water is called an ISLAND. A piece of land with three of its sides surrounded by water (Florida, for example) is called a PENINSULA.
