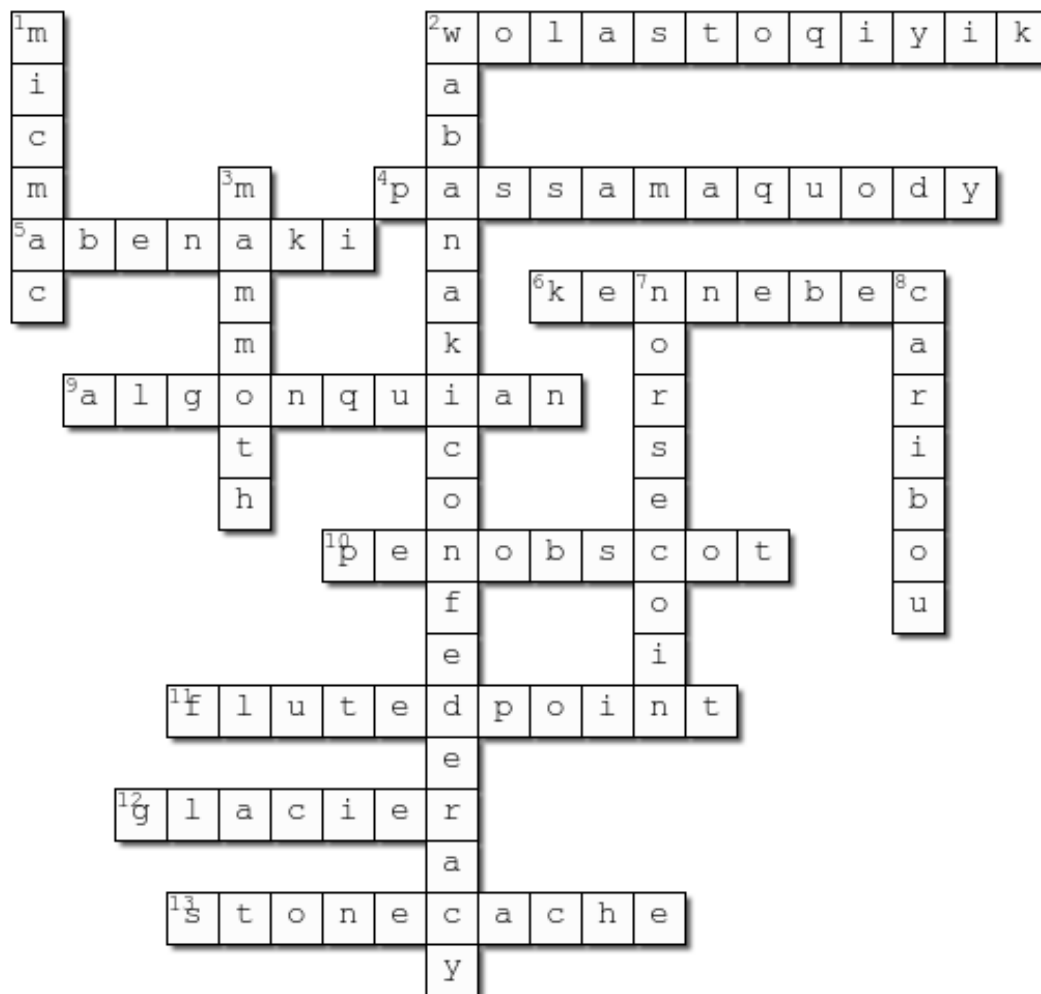


Pre-Columbian Maine Crossword Puzzle

Across

- This tribe hunted, fished, and farmed along the river known as Wolastoq (**wolastoqiyik**)
- This tribe located on St. Croix River had a wide spread trade spanning all over New England and Canada (**passamaquody**)
- The name of this tribe means "people of the dawn" or "easterners" (**abenaki**)
- This early Abenaki band lived on a river named after the Abenaki word Kinipek which translate to "bay" (**kennebec**)
- Many of Maine's Native American languages are part of this larger language group (**algonquian**)
- The name of this tribe comes from the word Panawahpskek which means "where the rocks spread out" (**penobscot**)
- A specially crafted stone tip used on spears and projectiles (**flutedpoint**)
- These large chunks of ice shaped much of the Maine that we know today (**glacier**)
- Formations of rock made to store meat by Maine's earliest inhabitants (**stonecache**)

Down

- This tribe in Aroostook county is recognized for the skills in making traditional birch bark boxes with porcupine quills (**micmac**)
- An alliance made up of the Abenaki, Penobscot, Micmac, Passamaquody, and Wolastoqiyik tribes (**wabanakiconfederacy**)
- Remains of this large tusked mammal were found in Scarborough Maine in 1959 (**mammoth**)
- Native Americans had a broad trade network, this unusual item was uncovered at a site believed to be a trade hub in Maine (**norsecoin**)
- This antlered animal that was a popular source of food for hunters (**caribou**)
