

Memorandum of an agreement entered into this 30th day of May 1825 between Seward Porter, Lemuel Moody & Geo. Deering, on the one part, & D. G. Johnson on the other part all of Portland viz. the said Johnson agrees to furnish suitable copper and engrave a plate for a chart which is to be furnished by the above named persons extending from Winter Harbor to the River Kennebeck and is the same chart which the said Johnson has examined the engraving to be done in a workmanlike manner and to be delivered to the said Porter, Moody & Deering on or before the first day of ~~September~~ October next for which work as a full compensation they the said Porter, Moody & Deering doth agree to pay to the said Johnson the sum of two hundred & twenty five dollars on the delivery of the said plate and a further sum of twenty five dollars whenever the said Porter Moody Deering shall have a greater number than three hundred copies struck off. The said Johnson agrees to strike off for them as soon as the plate is completed three hundred copies & no more they finding paper for the same from which he is to receive as a compensation the customary Boston price --

For the faithful performance of the above contract we do hereby agree and sett our respective names in testimony thereof.
