

Turnip Island lies NW from the middle of Jaquish, distance a fourth of a mile. This is a small Cow Island, without trees, and from it W by N, distance a fourth of a mile, lies Turnip Island ledge, which is seen before low water.

Between the south end of Baileys Island and Jaquish, there is a snug cove for the anchorage of fishermen. S.W. of the cove nearly a half mile is Turnip Island, on the S.E side of which you may pass when bound into the cove. On the N.E. side are ledges. The cove is not a suitable place for the anchorage of square rigged vessels.
