Jebaskadiggin Island, or what is now call'd Great Island, within the township of Harpswell, is on the western side of New Meadows River. It also makes part of Harpswell Sound, and the north part of it reaches within a few yards of the south point of Brunswick, with which it is join'd by a bridge.

This island is in length 6 ½ miles & its greatest breadth 3 miles. It has many small bays, coves and creeks, intersecting the outline of the island in almost every direction, altho' the island is 6 ¼ miles by [around], to trace the shore and follow its several windings you must travel the distance of 50 miles.

On its south side and at the entrance of Quahog Bay is Yarmouth Island, nearly <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of a mile in diameter. Between Yarmouth Island and the eastern point of Great Island there is a small and safe harbor with 5 to 3 fathoms water, where several vessels may find safe anchorage, secured from every wind.
