What we now call "Maine" is the homeland of the Wabanaki. Find references to the Wabanaki on a map. What does the location or content of those references say about the Wabanaki experience during that time period? Is there anything you can gather from these maps about the relationship between the Wabanaki and the colonists/citizens?

Find references to Maine's natural resources on these maps. What resources did you find? Does it seem that some resources were valued more at different time periods? Why do you think so?

Find the earliest map that shows railroads. What does the exact location of the railroad lines say about Maine at that time?

Find evidence of tourism in Maine in the maps from the late 1800s and early 1900s. On what map(s) did you find references to tourism? How, if at all, does the technology or settlement practices of the time period relate to development and popularity of tourism in Maine?

Find the differences between a map made during Maine's district-hood (before 1820) and a map made during Maine's statehood. Which maps did you look at, and what differences did you identify? What might those differences tell us about Maine's history?

Using the <u>provided map showing Wabanaki place names</u>, can you infer anything about the Wabanaki's relationship with the land before colonization?
